

Dr. Don O'Donoghue was teacher and friend of Prof. Albert Trillat






In 1950 he described the unhappy triad as: rupture of the medial collateral ligament, damage to the medial meniscus and rupture of the anterior cruciate ligament and proposed various surgical techniques.






In 1976 Albert Trillat began to perform the ACL reconstruction using a modified Kenneth Jones technique. Husing the middle third of the patellar tendon that was freed only proximally. The tendon, still attached to the tibial tuberosity entered the knee joint through the fat pad in front of the tibia.

And often it was too short!




After a visit of Ejnar Eriksson in Lyon the technique changed




Acute AMRI instabilty





Mid-third lateral capsular ligament tear













Anteromedial laxity POL and semimembranosus advancement






Anterolateral laxity Tenodesis of the ITT and biceps advancement








then the ISK foundation was made in Roma 1977
















Lyon 1979 First Congress of the ISK President Don O' Donoghue


during the Congress two "hot topics" were presented: meniscal suture and free patellar tendon graft




In Lyon in 1979 Dr. Kurt Franke of East Berlin presented his experience of 130 ACL reconstructions using a free graft of the central third of the patellar tendon as previously described in 1969 by Dr. Helmuth Brückner

Following Franke's publication, B-T-B was to become the most popular graft source and was further popularised through the work of Eriksson in Europe and Clancy in the United States










The fourth and final combined Congress of IAA and ISK was held in Hong Kong in 1995. The President of the IAA was Harold Eikelaar and the President of the ISK was Rene Marti.

That year the IAA and the ISK were dissolved and thanks to David Dandy and Kenneth Dehaven, the International Society of Arthroscopy, Knee surgery and Orthopaedic Sports Medicine (ISAKOS) was founded.

Its first President was Peter Fowler.
